Lisa is the author of nine books, including the award-winning Three Slovak Women, and hundreds of magazine articles. She

is a regular contributor to Nase Rodina, and has also published in Ancestry Magazine, Discovering Family History Magazine, Family Chronicle, Family Tree Magazine, Internet Genealogy, Reunions Magazine, NGS Magazine, Western Pennsylvania History Magazine, and The Association of Professional Genealogists Quarterly.
